The Summer season is full of water activities and we want to remind all our members that electricity and water do not mix. Follow these safety tips no matter what body of water you are enjoying this summer.

- · Do not swim around docks with electrical equipment
- All electrical wiring should be performed by a licensed contractor and inspected annually
- Docks should be wired with a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI)
- Metal frames of docks should be connected to ensure that any electrical malfunction will trip the circuit breaker
- · Metal docks should be properly grounded
- Neighborhood and private/personal docks present additional hazards if they are not properly maintained and inspected
- When you are in the water, if you feel electrical current
 - o Shout for help
 - o Tuck your legs up to make yourself smaller
 - o Swim away from anything that could be energized, especially boats, ladders and the dock


