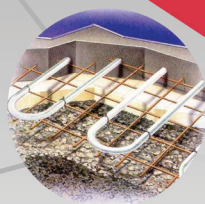
REBATE REMINDER

With only a few weeks left in 2023, you may be thinking about completing projects around the house which include energy-saving home-improvements. These projects may include purchasing new, energy efficient appliances or insulating your home.

If you have any such projects, be sure to check the energy rebates available to our members. Go to www.sre.coop/energy-rebates to see which Energy Star products qualify for a rebate.

The rebate application form and a copy of your receipt must be submitted **three months** after purchase or installation. However, members are encouraged to submit the information as soon as equipment is purchased and installed.

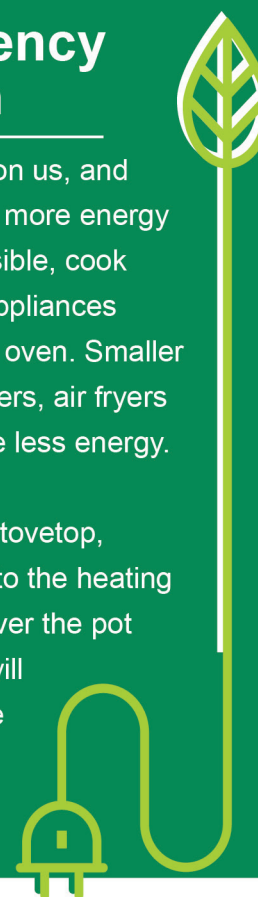


Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

The holiday season is upon us, and that means we'll be using more energy in the kitchen. When possible, cook with smaller countertop appliances instead of the stovetop or oven. Smaller appliances like slow cookers, air fryers and Instant Pots consume less energy.

When using the oven or stovetop, match the size of the pot to the heating element and place a lid over the pot while cooking. The food will cook faster, and you'll use less energy.
