Notification of Election of Directors in Districts 1, 5 and 9

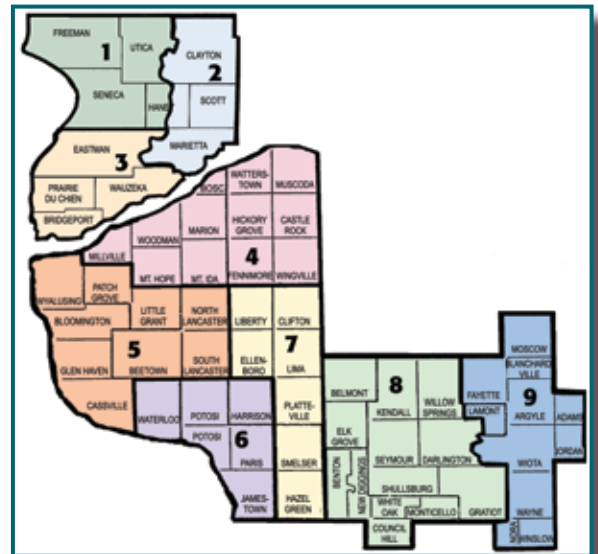
The terms of the directors in Districts 1, 5, and 9 expire at the 2017 annual meeting, when elections will be held for those position. All three incumbent directors are seeking re-election- Marcus Saegrove (District 1), Delbert Reuter (District 5) and Jack Larson (District 9). The Bylaws provide for nomination of candidates by petition. A petition must meet the following requirement:

- The petition must be signed by 15 or more members of Scenic Rivers Energy Cooperative. You may begin getting signatures for your petition on December 9, 2016 (but not before).
- The members signing the petition must reside in the same district the nominee would represent.
- In the case of a joint membership or a tenancy in common membership, one or all of the joint or common members may sign the petition, but whether only one signs or all sign it only counts as one (1) signature.
- The petition must be delivered to the Cooperative's headquarters in Lancaster at least 90 days prior to the annual meeting (April 8, 2017) – that is, no later than on January 8, 2017.

To be eligible to run for director, a candidate must meet all of the qualifications set forth in the Bylaws.

Those qualifications include:

- The candidate must be a member of Scenic Rivers Energy Cooperative and s/he must reside in the district to be represented. (See the map of the director districts included as part of this notice.)
- The candidate cannot:
 - be employed by or have a financial interest in a business that competes with the Cooperative or that sells energy or supplies to the Cooperative;
 - hold or be a candidate for a public office that is elected on a party ticket;
 - have been employed by the Cooperative anytime in the past 5 years;
 - participated as a party or a witness in any litigation against the Cooperative in the past 5 years;
 - be delinquent more than 90 days on the payment of any amount owed the Cooperative; or



- have been convicted of any offense involving dishonesty.
- The candidate must participate in an orientation process to assure an understanding of the responsibilities of directors (unless s/he is currently serving as a director). Information about that orientation will be provided to all qualified candidates nominated by petitions as described above.

In the case of a joint tenancy or tenancy in common membership, all the joint or common members must meet all of those qualifications in order for any one of the joint or common members to be eligible to be nominated.

As provided by the Bylaws, directors receive a monthly per diem. The current per diem is \$500 monthly.

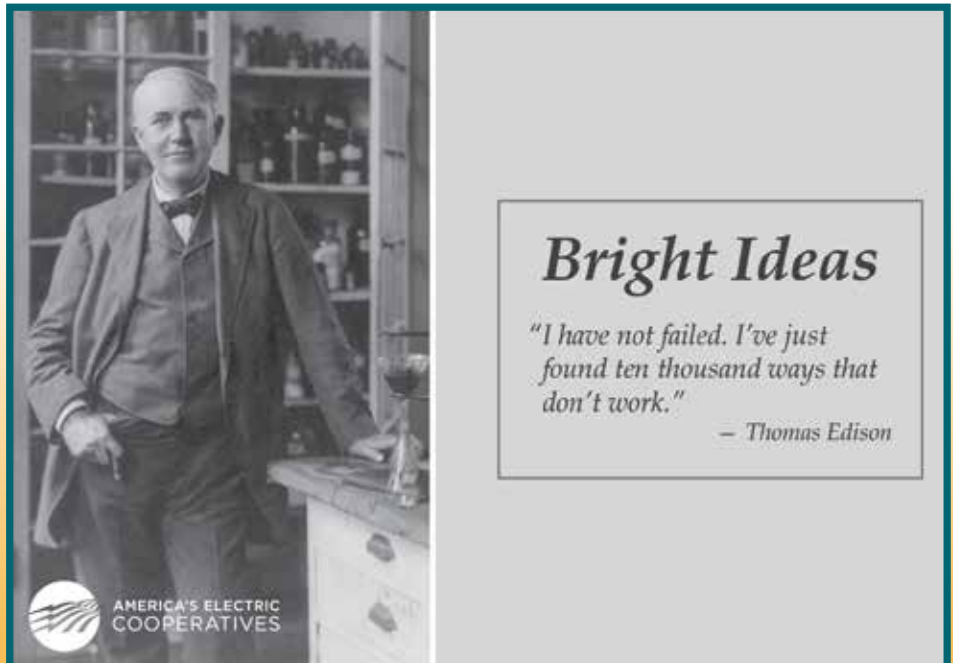

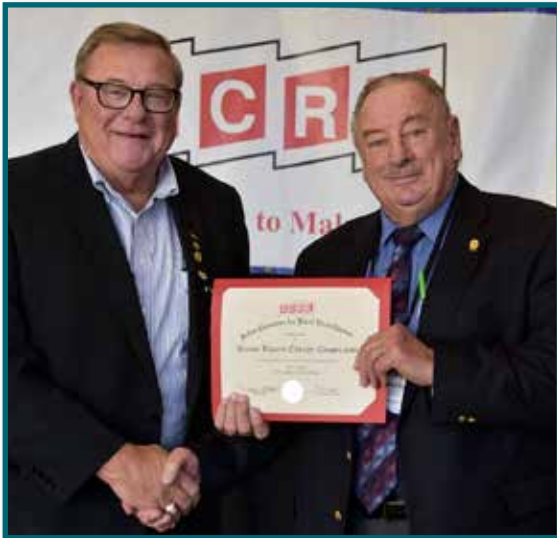
- “I have not failed. I’ve just found ten thousand ways that don’t work.”—Thomas Edison

**Energy Efficiency
 Tip of the Month**



Electric bills increase during the winter for a variety of reasons – holiday gatherings, houseguests, and shorter days and longer nights. Small measures, like turning down your thermostat, replacing incandescent bulbs with LEDs and washing clothes in cold water can help control energy costs.

HOLIDAY LIGHTING SAFETY TIPS

- Consider purchasing LED holiday lights; they are cool to the touch and more energy efficient than incandescent bulbs.
- Test holiday lights by connecting each strand before hanging them.
- Make sure there are no broken bulbs or damaged or frayed cords. Discard any defective strands.
- Use holiday lights that include the Underwriter's Laboratories (UL) label.
- Avoid resting bulbs on tree needles and branches. Try using a clip to keep the bulbs upright.
- Do not overload electrical outlets or extension cords.
- Turn off all indoor and outdoor holiday lighting before leaving the house or going to bed.

Recipes

Thank you Cathy Skaife (Platteville) for sharing your recipes! Regarding the Marbled Walnut Fudge, Cathy says "This sounds really hard but it is not. But I will tell you it is so delicious!!"

Marbled Walnut Fudge

- 18 oz. (3 cups) white baking chocolate chips
- 2 cans (14 oz. each) sweetened condensed milk
- 1 bag (12 oz.) semisweet chocolate chips
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 cup finely chopped walnuts or pecans
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Line a 13x9 inch pan with foil. Combine white chocolate chips and 1 can of condensed milk in a medium saucepan. Combine semi-sweet chips and remaining condensed milk in another saucepan. Add 1/4 teaspoon baking soda to EACH pan. Heat both over medium heat to low heat until chips are melted and smooth. This takes about 5 to 7 minutes. Stirring frequently. Remove pans from heat. Stir 1/2 cup nuts into each pan. Add vanilla to semisweet chocolate chips mixture. Spoon alternately mounds of chip mixtures into prepared pan. Swirl together with a knife. Refrigerate for 3 hours or until firm. Lift foil from pan. Cut into squares.



Easy Meatballs

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1/2 cup Progresso Italian-style bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 1 egg

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Line 13x9 inch pan with foil. Spray with cooking spray. In a large bowl, mix all ingredients. Shape mixture into 20 to 24 meatballs. Place 1 inch apart in pan. Bake uncovered 18 to 22 minutes or until no longer pink in center.
